Overview

The Raedwald Trust Outreach Service's PSHE and Relationships Curriculum is derived from objectives outlined by the PSHE Association and programmes that have been kite marked by them. Key skills and knowledge have been identified as being the most important 'messages' for our children to hear. The Outreach service has the flexibility to approach the totality of the curriculum and provide a bespoke curriculum to best meet the needs of the individual pupil.

The Raedwald Trust Outreach Service works in collaboration with the student's mainstream school to develop a bespoke curriculum for each learner. Where we are providing specific students with supplementary interventions in collaboration with their mainstream or other full-time educational placement we will focus on those aspects of the curriculum identified for us by the schools as being of the most benefit to the students. Where our students are – temporarily – not on the roll of a full-time provider, we are committed to providing a bespoke curriculum which meets their needs. We encourage all children to become independent learners and be confident in all strands of learning.

Impact

The purpose of our PSHE and Relationships programme of study is to equip pupils with a sound understanding of risk and with the knowledge and skills necessary to make safe and informed decisions.

The fundamental areas of study within our curriculum are:

- Mental Wellbeing
- Families
- Being safe
- Caring friendships
- Internet Safety
- Respectful Relationships

The Outreach Service often supports the most vulnerable learners and therefore we place significant importance on teaching lifesaving skills, such as:

- First Aid
- Road Safety

PSHE can take the form of discussion, role-play, viewing online content or reading a story as well as other activities. As agreed with pupil's mainstream settings, our settings will teach the agreed objectives but will not be responsible for teaching the unit in its entirety as outlined in the programme of study.

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PSHE and the wider curriculum

All teaching will be adapted to support individual pupil's needs in a bespoke approach. The curriculum and planning is flexible to ensure that we are responding to the current contexts of our children; both in terms of sensitivity to certain topics as well as recognising the need for a specific message as a rapid response.
