

## Year 7 Catch-up Premium

---

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium provides schools with additional funding for each Year 7 Student who did not achieve a scaled score of 100 at the end of Key Stage 2. It is provided to all maintained schools and academies with a Year 7 cohort, including special schools, alternative provision (AP) settings and pupil referral units (PRUs).

Only three sites within the Trust have Key Stage 3 cohorts; the number of Year 7's referred to us varies each year, but is often low.

### **Catch-up Premium spending for 2017-2018**

To address the needs of one Year 7 pupil, any additional funding received is used to support additional intervention costs not already incorporated into our highly specialised settings. Small group teaching ensures that Year 7's are allocated support in literacy and numeracy as well as access to appropriate additional intervention such as Lexia, Catch-Up literacy/numeracy, Dockside, etc at Alderwood Academy. If these additional strategies are not effective, funding is used to support the training of specialist staff in alternative interventions.

### **Assessing the Effect of Expenditure**

Attainment was measured through teacher assessment of pupil levels in English and Maths, discussion with key staff (Key Stage 3 lead teacher and Head of School).

### **Intended Use of Catch-Up Premium During 2018-2019**

At present, Key Stage 2 moderation and phonics funding accounts for the £400.00 received to date. This is to ensure that Alderwood Academy has an agreed and signed monitoring and moderation contract in place with the Local Authority.
