- Anxiety (Helen Griffiths Principal Clinical Psychologist – Oxford University Hospitals)

Training is led and delivered jointly by colleagues from the Raedwald Trust serving as MNIS – Suffolk and MNIS – Oxon. We are committed to supporting Children with Medical Needs in Suffolk and beyond.
