WHAT HAS CHANGED?



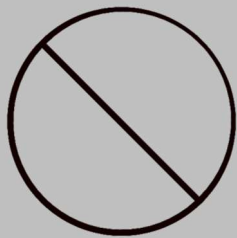
Reception, Year 1 & Year 6

Students in years 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11 need to stay at home unless invited in.



All students should continue to complete work on RT StudentHub and/or work that is sent home.

DOES MY CHILD HAVE TO COME TO SCHOOL?



If your child is well, and has been asked to come in, they should attend school.



There will be no fines if your child does not attend school.

WILL MY CHILD BE TESTED?



Yes, if your child is showing symptoms of Coronavirus, they will be eligible for testing.

HOW ARE YOU MAKING SURE THE SCHOOL IS SAFE?



We will check for risks before admitting more students.



Everyone will wash their hands regularly.



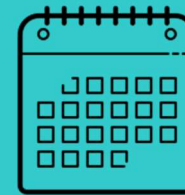
If any member of the school community or any member of their family is sick, they cannot come to school.



There will be fewer children in a room together.

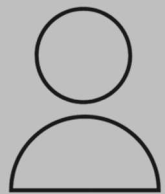


School will be cleaned regularly.

WHAT IF THERE IS A CASE OF CORONAVIRUS IN SCHOOL?



7 DAYS



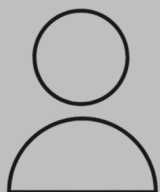
The person with symptoms must isolate for 7 days.



14 DAYS



The people they live with must self isolate for 14 days.



14 DAYS



If any tests positive at school, the group they were with must self isolate for 14 days.
