

# 1:1 BESPOKE OUTREACH

## WHAT'S IT ABOUT?

Running throughout the academic year, our 1:1 bespoke outreach is a pastoral and academic programme designed to refocus and re-engage EYFS, KS1, KS2, KS3 and KS4 pupils who, for whatever reason, have disengaged from mainstream education. The programme is designed to run alongside pupils' mainstream education.

Each programme is bespoke, and tailored to meet individual pupil need but can include:

- EYFS curriculum and phonics
- KS1, KS2, KS3 or KS4 English, maths & science
  - Non-core KS1, KS2, KS3 or KS4 subjects
  - Careers & post-16 pathway support
- Bespoke PSHE programme which can include PSED, online safety, self-esteem, mental health, substance misuse, gangs and joint enterprise, exploitation, healthy relationships and radicalisation
  - Enrichment opportunities
    - Life skills
  - Transition support
  - Re-integration support
    - Workplace visits
    - Classroom support
    - Behaviour support
  - "Thrive" assessment & action plan
  - Home visits & regular monitoring visits
    - Termly progress reports

The 1:1 programme targets specific challenges faced by young people whilst focusing on how to make positive life choices in order to improve life chances both in school and the community.



**Profile of pupil:** EYFS, KS1, KS2, KS3 or KS4 / two or more fixed term exclusions this academic year / at risk of permanent exclusion / at risk of exploitation and / or offending behavior / at risk of school refusal / social & emotional difficulties.
