- contribute effectively to planning and preparation of learning activities and resources as required
- have relevant experience in Early Years or Key Stage one, preferably including supporting SEN or challenging behaviour
- have experience of supporting phonics and early reading, writing and maths skills
- be able to demonstrate effective behaviour management strategies
- have the ability to build positive, nurturing relationships with young people
- be a good team player
- be flexible, resilient and calm under pressure
- demonstrate a positive attitude towards all stakeholders
- have GCSE English and mathematics at Level C or above (or equivalent).

As part of the Raedwald Trust Team, you will support pupils in-centre during the school day (including lunch time duties), communicate with families and outside agencies, and enable inclusion within community schools via advisory role during outreach.
