

1:1 BESPOKE OUTREACH

WHAT'S IT ABOUT?

Running throughout the academic year, our 1:1 bespoke outreach is a pastoral and academic programme designed to refocus and re-engage EYFS, KS1, KS2, KS3 and KS4 pupils who, for whatever reason, have disengaged from mainstream education. The programme is designed to run alongside pupils' mainstream education.

Full Day or Half Day packages available:

Full Day (up to 5 hours) - Cost: £310 per pupil, per day (third party provider/enrichment costs not included)

- Includes half a day at a Raedwald Trust site and half a day with a third party provider/enrichment activity.
- Core subjects taught in line with pupil's ILP.
- Pastoral/behaviour support tailored to meet the needs of the pupil.
- Pupils supported by Raedwald Trust staff throughout the day.
- Home to school transport available at a cost.
- Additional transport costs will apply to schools outside Ipswich.
- School or home to provide pupil with a packed lunch.

Half Day (up to 2.5 hours) - Cost: £165 per pupil, per half day

- Support at home or at mainstream school (no transport included)
- Additional transport costs will apply to schools outside Ipswich.
- Core subjects taught in line with pupil's ILP.
- Pastoral/behaviour support tailored to meet the needs of the pupil.

Half Day (up to 2.5 hours) - Cost: £165 per pupil, per half day

- Support at a Raedwald Trust site.
- Core subjects taught in line with pupil's ILP.
- Pastoral/behaviour support tailored to meet the needs of the pupil.
- Home to school transport available at a cost.
- Additional transport costs will apply to schools outside Ipswich.

Half Day (up to 2.5 hours) – Cost to be provided on request

- Half day visit to third party provider/enrichment activity.
- Pupils supported by Raedwald Trust staff throughout the session.
- Home to school transport available at a cost.
- Additional transport costs will apply to schools outside Ipswich.

Profile of pupil: EYFS, KS1, KS2, KS3 or KS4 / two or more fixed term exclusions this academic year / at risk of permanent exclusion / at risk of exploitation and / or offending behavior / at risk of school refusal / social & emotional difficulties.
