WHAT'S IT ABOUT?

The Resilience Project is a KS1 and KS2 pastoral and academic programme designed to support pupils to access their mainstream curriculum. The aim is to refocus pupils whilst building resilience and self-esteem and encouraging positive choices. The programme is designed to run alongside pupils' mainstream education.

A termly small group academic & pastoral programme which runs alongside mainstream education, designed to re-engage KS1-2 pupils using kinesthetic and practical teaching and learning methods within an alternative setting.

Aimed at pupils with anxiety linked behaviours (SEMH – but presents as withdrawn, school refusal, high level anxiety). By the end of the programme, the aim is for pupils to return to their mainstream school full time.

Included in the programme is:

- Two full days a week of support (10 hours in total) which includes two half days of academic learning and two half days at a third party provider/ enrichment activity to support elements of the curriculum
 - 1:2 staffing
 - Small group work to encourage peer working and positive relationships
 - English and maths support in line with pupil's ILP and curriculum
 - Therapeutic interventions

The pupil will attend their mainstream setting for the remaining three days a week



The programme will be tailored to meet individual pupil needs and therefore may also include:

- Behaviour support
- Transition support
- Re-integration support

Profile of pupil: KS1 and KS2 / social and emotional difficulties / at risk of exploitation / at risk of under achieving.
