Pathways Explained

Springboard Pathway

Purpose: To support pupil to succeed in their current mainstream school placement (pupils must have an on-roll mainstream school).

- A more intense intervention for a pupil who will successfully reintegrate into fulltime mainstream education. Support for personal, social and emotional development alongside possible behaviour concerns. EHCP not required for referral.
- Pupil will attend a Raedwald Trust setting for a 19 week placement.
- Dual placement with mainstream school. Pupil continues to attend school 2 or 3 days/week with 2 or 3 days/week at Raedwald site, with weekly outreach support.
- During mainstream days, the pupil will attend at least 2 hours a day, increasing time in school (if applicable) over 19 weeks.
- Outreach session will be delivered in mainstream setting for 1 hour a week on a Thursday or a Friday.
- Progress reports provided to mainstream setting throughout RT placement.

Building Pathway

Purpose: To support pupil to succeed in their current mainstream school placement (pupils must have an on-roll mainstream school).

- A more intense intervention for a pupil who will successfully reintegrate into fulltime mainstream education. Support for personal, social and emotional development alongside possible behaviour concerns. EHCP not required for referral.
- Pupil will attend a Raedwald Trust setting for a 19 week placement
- Pupil continues to attend mainstream school 1 day per week during weeks 1 – 15; 2 days per week during weeks 16 and 17 and 3 days per week during weeks 18 and 19.
- Pupils to attend Raedwald site on: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday. Thursday will be the home school day.
- During mainstream days, the pupil will attend at least 2 hours a day, increasing time in school (if applicable) over the 19 week placement.
- Fortnightly outreach support offered in mainstream school (Thursdays).
- Progress reports provided to mainstream setting throughout RT placement.

How to make a referral

In order to complete this referral, you will need:

- Evidence of parent/carer consent.
- The voice of the child or young person and parent/carer.
- Supporting documentation on assessments and/or interventions and their impact.
- Current risk assessment(s).
- A named designated Professional Lead and their contact details. This individual will be responsible for the referral and monitoring progress throughout the placement.

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Alderwood Academy, Ipswich

A KS2/KS3 provision which offers placements on Building pathway, Building Enhanced, Y6/Y7 Transition and Haven pathway.

Pathways Explained

Building Enhanced Pathway

Purpose: To support pupils who may have low attendance or be in receipt of a reduced timetable and need support to re-engage in education.

- Pupil will attend a Raedwald Trust setting for a 19 week placement
- A short, early intervention for a Key Stage 2 pupil who is attending a mainstream school and has the potential to be successful but needs an intensive short-term intervention to enable this.
- School will already have implemented strategies to support the pupil in school.
- Professionals in agreement that previously identified SEND needs will be explored as part of the placement and RT to support with EHCNA (where necessary).
- Pupil will attend Raedwald site on a Monday and Tuesday. Wednesday – Friday pupil will access his/her mainstream setting.
- EHCP not required for referral

Transition Pathway (Year 6 into Year 7) *NEW*

Purpose: To support Year 6 pupils at risk of PEX through the final two terms of primary school and subsequently to support transition into autumn term of Year 7.

- A pathway designed to support pupils in Year 6 at risk of permanent exclusion, providing support and stability as they move through Year 6 and into Year 7. Work will then continue alongside the named secondary provision to allow a more thorough transition through the Autumn term.
- Year 6 admission onto Pathway at start of Spring term for remainder of Key Stage 2, then Autumn term in Key Stage 3 with a focus on transition into secondary provision.
- Pupils to attend Raedwald Trust Monday Wednesday; Thursday and Friday accessing mainstream setting.
- Outreach support will be a weekly virtual meeting with face to face outreach support occurring in school every three weeks.
- Progress reports provided to mainstream setting throughout RT placement
- EHCP not required for referral

St. Christopher's Academy

A KS2—KS4 provision which offers placements on the Next Steps Medical (NSM) pathway, KS2—KS4 Engage pathway and KS1—KS4 MNiS.

Pathways Explained

Next Steps Medical Pathway

Purpose: To support mainstream setting to identify underlying SEND needs that may support onward referrals for additional input.

- Available to pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 only at KS2.
- Support for children and young people with a complexity of needs, including mental health needs, who may also need an EHA or an Individual Healthcare Plan (IHP) in place at the outset of involvement to ensure that a multiprofessional approach is maintained.
- Referral evidence from an appropriate medical professional is required.
- Pupil must have a mainstream school and will attend Raedwald in line with clinician advice.
- IHCP is required for referral.
- EHCP not required for referral

Engage Pathway

Purpose: To support any pupil identified by a school to have persistent poor punctuality and/or attendance.

- Pupil must have a mainstream school roll.
- Pupil will be supported to access their mainstream school for up to 12 weeks with up to 10 hours of agreed bespoke support each week.
- Staff will help the pupil to access their mainstream school through a variety of interventions and techniques to support the wider school and family.
- EHCP not required for referral

Medical Needs in Schools (MNiS)

Purpose: To equip education staff with the confidence to support all children within their schools who are experiencing either a physical or mental health condition and to be able to choose the best approaches, including using remote technologies (if appropriate), to support them.

- Includes either direct pupil support (KS2-KS4) or school-to-school support (KS1-KS4)
- Pupil must have a mainstream school roll.
- Usually completed within 6-12 months with ongoing support for individual pupils as required.
